

Working Towards "Nanzan Elementary School Where Every Student Grows through Learning" ~Nurturing Global Character~ ~Establishing the School with the Community~

Regarding the parents' survey for the evaluation of the school conducted in December, the School Councilors' Board met on February 13 (Thu), so the results are being published here.

The title of this article reflects the school's vision, and in regards to this the general results indicate over 90% affirmative responses from parents and guardians. (Please refer to the chart on the right.)

[Academics] For questions 1 and 2, one in ten respondents indicated that they are not satisfied with the school's academics. The Nanzan Style has been established in order for students to "consider," "expand," and "deepen" their understanding, and in the new school year we will be working hard to further realize the school's vision. Regarding number 5, "improving the students' physical strength," an emphasis is being placed on throwing ability, the school will be devising new ways to familiarize students with exercises.

[Engagement in School Activities] In regards to questions 3 and 6, the efforts of the students received high evaluation, from which the faculty felt a sense of fulfillment and achievement from the efforts of their guidance. We will continue promoting the betterment of our academic activities as part of the "Nanzan Brand."

Regarding questions 4 and 7 "Life Guidance," question 8 "Special Education," and question 9 "Academic Consultation," the school considers the necessity of more meaningful responses, such as the establishment of the school's structure, creating a rapid response, and developing of mutual understanding with the families.

[Dissemination of Information] In regards to question 10, the school will strive to quickly issue letters and notices that are easy to understand and accurate, and work towards heightening coordination with families and the community.

[From the School Councilors' Board to the School Management Council]

Through joint contribution of wisdom and incorporation of ideas into the operation of the schools, the School Management Council is a structure from which the schools, families, and community members promote "Establishment of the School with the Community" while working together to support the rich growth of the children. The Act on the Organization and Operation of Local Educational Administration (section 47 article 6) is the basis of this system.

The School Management Council has been established by the Minato City Board of Education so that the school, families, and community member can work together using the following three points to promote the development of the school.


1 School development that allows students to be safe and secure

2 School development that allows students to be lively and enjoy learning

3 School development that gains the trust of the families and the community

According to regulations of the School Management Council, meetings are held from five to eight times a year. The members of the council are appointed by the Board of Education, and are mainly people from the community, family members, individuals who play a part in the school management activities (community coordinators etc.), school and kindergarten principals, former faculty, administrators (members of the police and fire departments, etc.) At these meetings, discussions are held regarding the approval of school curriculum and school management, as well as other matters as deemed necessary by the school and kindergarten principals. A record is kept of the contents of each discussion, which is then reported to the Board of Education.

Our school, along with Nanzan Kindergarten, will establish and engage in the School Management Council in the new school year based on the points listed above. Our goal is to continue ~Establishing the School with the Community~.
