Grade 6 is planning to do job shadowing at stores in the Azabujuban Shopping Arcade in October.

On June 9 (Sat), with Roppongi Hills Arena as the stage, 25 volunteers from our school from grades 3 to 6 had the opportunity to join in the "Nihon Genki Project" produced by Kansai Yamamoto. Lower Grades "To Protect Yourself From a Suspicious Person"

Many children have experienced being talked to by strangers on the way to or from home and school.

Grade 1 and 2 students were instructed by Secom staff on how to protect themselves when they are talked to by strangers.

The students learned through role-playing that it is hard to judge whether the person is a bad person from how they look and it is important to say "No" or "I don't know" clearly when they are talked to by strangers.

Middle Grades "Traffic Safety"

The students thought about and were instructed on how to ride a bicycle safely while watching a DVD about bicycle safety. They also learned about good points for inspecting their bicycles. The students listened seriously as there were many terms that they learned for the first time and they reconsidered about their way of riding a bicycle.



Upper Grades "Getting Along with SNS"

Grade 5 did a practical study on how to choose and use words carefully. The students understood that the impression given by casual language can depend on the person reading it, and that they should think carefully before writing anything. Grade 6 imagined situations in which SNS might be overused, judging when it is and is not appropriate to use it, and learned the importance of using it effectively and efficiently.
