Happy New Year! I would like to express my sincere appreciation for your understanding and cooperation in the academic activities of our school over the past year. In particular, I was very happy to see the students' enthusiasm as we were able to hold the Sports Day and the School Performance as we did before the Covid pandemic.

2024 is the Chinese zodiac year of the Wood Dragon "Kinoetatsu." This way of calculating the time and date comes from the Shang Dynasty period in ancient China and was found in the texts of the Oracle Bone Script. The "Wood" is one of the 10 heavenly stems (an ancient way to count ordinal numbers) and the "Dragon" comes from the 12 zodiac animals, also known as the 12 earthly branches.

The "Kinoe" is the first of the 12 heavenly branches and represents the number one and the beginning of things. It is also said to represent other things such as dominance and a large tree that stands straight and towering.

The "Tatsu" refers to the dragon, the only fictional creature in the twelve Chinese zodiac signs. The dragon, which has been worshipped as the god of water and the sea, symbolizes the dynamism of nature that causes natural phenomena such as tornadoes and thunderstorms, and it has been said that "when the dragon appears, happy things will happen. It is said that "Kinoetatsu," which combines these two symbols, represents the auspiciousness of "the bud of success growing and taking shape

As we begin the year 2024, the year of the Wood Dragon, what kind of year do you hope to have? I hope that the students of Nanzan can have a pleasant year, leading the way like "Kinoe," and like "Tatsu," the dragon, with has great momentum.

We ask for your understanding and cooperation in our academic activities this year as well.
