The Special Support Classroom (Step Room)

Since the 2016 school year, our school has operated a Special Support Classroom (known as the "Step Room") to provide tailored assistance for students with developmental characteristics that may affect their daily life or learning. This dedicated space offers individualized support designed to meet each student's specific needs. In the Step Room, students set personalized goals and engage in learning activities suited to their developmental stage and learning profile. Here are some examples of the kinds of support we provide:

- For students who find it difficult to speak appropriately in different situations, we conduct expression practice through role-play and guided conversations. This helps them learn appropriate language use and communication skills that suit various social contexts, such as playing or talking with friends.
- For students who struggle with body coordination, posture, or self-regulation, we offer repeated physical exercises designed with various challenges. These activities aim to improve their sense of balance, tactile awareness, and motor control.

Through this kind of individualized learning, we aim to help each student thrive in their regular classroom setting and lead a fulfilling school life. We remain committed to continuing this support so that every child can grow and learn in a positive and inclusive environment.

Grade 1

OTaking home of study materials

As we approach summer vacation, starting next week, students will gradually begin bringing their learning materials home. When your child brings home their tote bag, please have them bring it back to school the following day. During the summer break, please keep the learning materials at home and send them back with your child at the start of the second term. Grade 2

O Taking Home the garden balsam plant

As part of our Science studies, students have been growing garden balsam plants. We kindly ask that you take your child's plant home during the parent-teacher conference period. Students will have observation homework over the summer, so we also ask for your help with watering and care during the break.
